Her supervisor, John Garst, nominated her for her diligence in working with representatives at Zurn factory to acquire rebuild kits for automatic sink faucets for the restrooms at the North Carolina Research Center in Kannapolis. When told by a representative at Zurn that no kits were available, she took the initiative to call a managerial representative and found that there were, in fact, rebuild kits available for these automatic faucets. She informed the manager of misinformation received from their service representative. As a result of the conversation, the managerial representative sent 12 rebuild kits at \$93.33 each at no charge. Total cost for these rebuild kits would have been \$1,119.96. The replacement faucet costs would have been \$386.41 each and there were five bad faucets, totaling \$1,932.05. As a total, Karen save the Kannapolis property approximately \$3,052.00 in repair costs from one phone call!

Karen's "over the top" effort sets a high standard for all to follow. She is a valuable member of Facilities Management. Thanks again for "thinking out of the box" to find a solution to a problem which saved us time and money!!

Event or activity generated a novel, creative or valuable idea used to develop new or improved processes, methods, systems, products, or services that improved or made FM or UNC Charlotte a better place to work. (Details of the event should be listed)

Employee will receive the card prior to the All Employees Meeting. All who receive applause cards for the quarter will be noted on a slide during the All Employees Meeting.
